

#### **Calvary UMC Maundy Thursday Service**

Pastor Robin will be leading a Maundy Thursday service at the church on April 17 beginning at 7:00 PM.

Maundy Thursday, also known as Holy Thursday, carries deep biblical significance, marking pivotal events in Jesus' life. It invites you to reflect on themes of love, service, and sacrifice.


The Last Supper represents the final meal Jesus shared with his disciples before his crucifixion.

During this meal, Jesus instituted the Eucharist, breaking bread and sharing wine to symbolize his body and blood. This act underscores his sacrifice for humanity. It also serves as a reminder for you to nourish your spiritual life through communion with God and one another.

On Maundy Thursday, Jesus emphasizes the commandment of love. He instructs his disciples to love one another as he has loved them (John 13:34–35). This commandment highlights the importance of selfless service and compassion in your interactions. Jesus exemplifies this love through the washing of his disciples' feet, teaching you about humility and the value of serving others. By embracing this commandment, you strengthen your relationships and foster community.

Foot washing symbolizes humility and service. During the Last Supper, Jesus washed the feet of his disciples, an act typically performed by the lowest servant. This gesture teaches you to put others before yourself. It emphasizes that leadership stems from serving others selflessly. In modern practice, many churches reenact this event, encouraging members to participate, fostering a spirit of community and mutual respect.

Communion represents the establishment of the Eucharist. During the Last Supper, Jesus broke bread and shared wine, saying, "This is my body" and "This is my blood." This ritual signifies the new covenant between God and humanity through Jesus' sacrifice. It invites you to reflect on the meaning of sacrifice and redemption. Participating in Communion during Maundy Thursday connects you to the sacred tradition, deepening your commitment to faith and community.





## **Easter Sunrise Service at Calvary**

Easter Sunrise Service will be held at Calvary United Methodist Church on April 20 beginning at 6:30 PM. In recent years, the service has been held outside at the Bell Tower depending on the weather. Please bring a chair (and a blanket) as the group will gather around the fire pit at that time of the morning.

On Easter Sunday, the holiest of days in the Christian calendar, many Christians start their morning with an Easter sunrise service. The ritual celebrates the resurrection of Jesus, which speaks to Christianity's most fundamental belief: The Lord has risen, defeating

death and bringing salvation and eternal life to everyone who puts their faith in him. The agony of the cross has been replaced by the ecstasy of the Resurrection. As Paul declared in his first letter to the Corinthians: "O death, where is thy sting? O grave, where is thy victory? The sting of death is sin; and the strength of sin is the law. But thanks be to God, which giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ."

For Christians, the reason for timing this service to coincide with the rising of the sun is simple: It was dawn when the first believers — in every gospel account, women — went to the tomb of Jesus, found the rock rolled away from the entrance and the body of Jesus gone. So, it makes sense that this that earth-shaking event would be celebrated as the sun comes up.

Reservations must be made by April 30. Sign-up sheets will be placed in the narthex closer to the banquet's date. Any questions may be directed to Donna Hayes.


There will be a fun game and a door prize!

## Art Jones' Bible Study - The Walk by Adam Hamilton

How do we walk with Christ – daily follow Him, grow in Him, and faithfully serve Him? In the Gospels, Jesus modeled for us the Christian spiritual life. The apostles taught it I their writings. And the Church has, through the last 2,000 years, sought to pursue this Christian spiritual life.

In this study Adam Hamilton focuses on five essential spiritual practices that are rooted in Jesus' own walk with God and taught throughout the New Testament. Each of these practices is a part of our daily walk with Christ and an essential part of

growing together in the church. Deepen your walk with Christ as we explore the five essential practices of worship, study, serving, giving and sharing our faith.

#### There are six sessions:

- 1 March 6 Worship and Prayer: A Living Hallelujah
- 2 March 13 Study: The Importance of Listening and Paying Attention
- 3 March 20 Serve: Here I Am, Lord, Send Me
- 4 March 27 Give: Where Your Treasure Is...
- 5 April 3 Share: Going Fishing, Reflecting Light
- 6 April 10 The Five Practices from the Cross

The following is a narrative provided by Rev. Dr. Hale.

I was first licensed as a Local Pastor in the former Wyoming Conference in 1998. I attended seminary in Boston and was ordained in 2010 in the Upper New York Conference. I have served rural and suburban churches throughout upstate New York and most recently in central PA.

Through my passion for mission and outreach in the local community and beyond, I have encouraged churches to begin "Church Has Left the Building" programs and become more involved in the United Methodist missions such as Mission Central and UMCOR.

I strive to construct creative relative, thematic, and engaging worship services, and to give people ample opportunities to respond in various ways, such as renewing their baptismal vows or coming forward to be anointed during healing services. My preaching is focused on the life and teachings of Jesus and on discipleship, and I always try to teach people something new or given them a new way of understanding their faith. I encourage people to share their gifts in worship by reading scripture, providing music, adorning the sanctuary and altar area, creating artwork, and using other skills that enhance our experience of God's presence.

I love to teach and enjoy leading studies of all kinds, including Bible studies and topical studies (such as United Methodist history or doctrine). One of my greatest joys is to see the "lightbulb" go on for people when they learn something new and helpful for their faith journey.

Music is a delight for me! Although my singing voice is not what I wish it could be, I play piano, organ, violin, and trumpet, and I have led and arranged music for handbell choirs.

Because I have hearing loss, I am passionate about accessibility of all kinds, and I have a heart for others with disabilities. I function well in most situations, but in certain settings, such as very noisy room, I will need to ask people to go to a quieter place to speak with me. I've always found my congregations to be more than willing to accommodate my needs.

Visitation and keeping in touch with shut-ins are very important to me, and I enjoy leading worship services in nursing and personal care facilities.

I am familiar with all kinds of technology and am always willing to learn new ways of communicating with people.

Outside of the church, I am an avid student of the battle of Gettysburg and the Civil War in general. I have completed part of the process to become a Licensed Battlefield Guide. I am working on a book about Union chaplains, and as a Union Army chaplain reenactor, I have led Civil War Divine Services on the field at Gettysburg and at churches other locations.

I have three grown sons, two daughters-in-law, and three adorable grandchildren, who all live on Long Island. (Pictures available on request!) Oh, and I have four cats who are (mostly) well-behaved.


#### **American Red Cross Blood Drive**








## This Week's Children's Message with Sara Nelson
